Changes at Church Stretton Library

£10,000 Raised for Library Refurbishment

We offered Shropshire Library Service £10,000 from funds raised in previous years, to replace some fixed shelf units with more modern display units. This will allow the library to provide a more flexible use of space when hosting events and school visits. Shropshire Library Services have now managed to find funding to add to this, so we are pleased to say that a complete refurbishment should take place in 2023.

Thank you to everyone who helped make this possible through your donations and by supporting our events.

New LED Lighting

We are delighted the old lighting in the library has finally been replaced with LED lights. This is in response to a request from Friends, after we learnt people with poor eyesight were struggling to read the Large Print books because the lighting wasn't bright enough. If you have any other suggestions for improvements to the library – please let us know.

Shropshire Council Library Strategy 2022 to 2027

Shropshire council have approved a new library strategy which means libraries have to provide additional services to ensure they stay relevant in the future. Libraries thus face a balancing act: retaining their traditional role while attracting new users. Part of the strategy is that self-service facilities are to be rolled out to all libraries. It is hoped this automation will free up library staff time to handle other enquiries.


Providing additional services in small market towns such as Church Stretton will mean people do not have to travel to Shrewsbury for them. However, this needs to be done carefully, so library staff do not find themselves overwhelmed, or without the time to support more traditional library functions.

Funding children's activities

We paid for an all-day storyteller and craft session for children in the library during the summer holidays. Five one-hour sessions were held during the day, each session covering a different story with a related Art/Craft activity.

Local story-teller Sal Tonge worked with Lesley McKnight from Scrappies to deliver this event. It proved extremely popular and we hope to subsidise more events for children in the library this year.

Improving library facilities



Following a suggestion made at our last AGM, we refurbished the Visitor Information Centre notice boards and installed a new hanging system for setting up exhibitions. Thank you to Geoff Taylor and Malcom Phillips who volunteered to assist with this. It has really livened up the room.

We also replaced the badly damaged planter outside the building, purchased a new advertising 'A frame' and bought various pieces of kitchen equipment.

Volunteering in the Visitor Information Centre

Our expanding team of volunteers continue to open the Visitor Information Centre (VIC) from February to November on Mondays and Wednesdays when the library is closed. In 2022 they provided help and information to a staggering 1,456 visitors. Our thanks to everyone who has helped to make this possible. This work helps the library meet one of the new Shropshire Library Strategy targets, that of promoting Economic Recovery and Growth. The Visitor Information Centre attracts visitors into the town, which helps keep local businesses financially viable.
